15 mins 15:20 – 15:35	 4) Update on the Upper Yarra Timber Transition Project is currently at the stage of starting up innovation working groups across the following categories: Eco tourism Energy resilience & renewable energy Repurposing abandoned places Improving transport and access Animal processing facility (abattoir) Sustainable & productive land management Noted that an abattoir would assist in disposing of feral deer which has been mentioned at prior meetings. 20 mins 15:35 – 15:55	 5) Council protocol regarding lost and wandering livestock. If livestock are found to be lost or on a roadway, Council can be contacted. Safer communities team help move livestock off the road if necessary. If owner cannot be found, animals are impounded at Council facilities and if owners still cannot be found, animals are re-homed. Concern around members of the public placing animals into fencing on properties that they may not belong to, creating biosecurity risks. Potential for council messaging regarding what to do if you see lost livestock to increase public awareness to correct process. Emergency management: when people gather with animals in an emergency, animals are checked for recent vaccinations, worming, etc. Problem of roosters being dumped after school hatching programs. Correct procedure: Call Council on 1300 368 333, call will be transferred to the team. This is the quickest way to get in touch and report. 20 mins 15:55 – 16:15	 6) Healthy and Active Ageing Plan - Consultation around the new plan in development and aging in place - Delays in services available to people in rural areas, reducing the ability for people to age in place. - Additional dwelling opportunities needed for those aging in place on farms. Concerns around the regulations that can inhibit this. - Community or Council used to have community busses that would transport elderly, and that this would be a benefit if brought back. Isolation causes those aging to continue driving to access medical facilities. Mobility access for parking and safety of driving narrow streets. More promotion of seniors parking could assist. - Reliance on digital technologies that older generations don't like using or cannot use. - Lack of succession planning. Earlier conversations needed regarding transition to retirement. - Lack of superannuation, especially among women. - Mental health benefits of aging on farm are high, but aforementioned issues can inhibit it. - Property management concerns. Opportunity for collaborations between property owners and those who want to farm the land. - Possibility of doctor, pharmacy, etc visits to the residence would assist.
